MYSEJAHTERA CHECK-INS IS NO LONGER REQUIRED 1 MAY 2022





MySejahtera Check-in is no longer mandatory to enter premises or public areas from 1 May 2022

Entry to premises are allowed regardless of vaccination status

COVID-19 positive cases with "High RIsk" status on MySejahtera and those under HSO are prohibited from entering premises

Premise owners are required to check visitors' risk status on Mysejahtera



MASK WEARING RULES AND RECOMMENDATIONS FROM 1 MAY 2022



From 1 May 2022, mask-wearing will only be required for indoor settings

Mask-wearing will be optional in outdoor settings

Mask-wearing is still encouraged in crowded outdoor areas and for high-risk individuals

Mask can be removed indoors in certain situations such as eating, when exercising alone, when giving a speech or when performing on stage

Settings	Examples
Indoor (mask is mandatory)	Within office buildings, shopping malls, lifts
	 Within public transport such as buses, trains and e-hailing rides
	Within classrooms
Outdoor (mask is optional)	Outside of house or office buildings
	Bus stops
	Parks, fields
	 Open-air walkways and bridges



COVID-19 SOP RELAXATIONS FROM 1 MAY 2022



MASKS

- Mandatory indoors including public transports and e-hailing rides
- Optional when outdoors but encouraged in crowded places. High risk individuals are also encouraged to wear a mask.

PHYSICAL DISTANCING

- No longer required
- Encrouraged when not wearing a mask

MYSEJAHTERA CHECK-IN AND VACCINATION STATUS

- Check-in is no longer required
- Entry to premises are allowed regardless of vaccination status except those with "High Risk" status or under HSO

COVID-19 POSITIVE (TEST AND RELEASE)

By default, COVID-19 positive cases are required to quarantine for 7days. However, under Test and Release, they will have an option to **undergo a supervised RTK-Ag test on the 4th day.** If tested negative, they may be released from quarantine.

TRAVEL

- Fully vaccinated travellers and children aged 12 and below are exempted from pre-departure and on-arrival tests
- Partially or not vaccinated travellers must take an RT-PCR test 2 days before departure and a supervised RTK-Ag test within 24 hours of arrival. They will also have a quarantine for 5 days.
- COVID-19 insurance is no longer required for all travellers entering Malaysia

NEGATIVE LIST

The National Security Council's negative list (banned activities is no longer applicable. All economic sectors are allowed to operate from 15 May 2022
