HALF DAY TOUR (EX. CITY)

KUCHING CITY TOUR (DURATION: 3 HOURS+-)

Includes: All guided tour, Entrance fee, and 1 bottle of drinking water

Kuching, the capital of Sarawak, is a cosmopolitan city, and this is reflected in the faces on the street. Its city centre is well preserved, with ornate houses of worship such as the Kuching City Mosque and Tua Pek Kong Temple, as well as many fine examples of colonial-style architecture, including the Square Tower, which stands alongside the historical Astana and Fort Margherita, the ultramodern State Legislative Assembly building (DUN), and the Golden Bridge, overlooking the Kuching Waterfront.

The iconic cat statue strategically dotted along the city centre, a symbol of Kuching City's mascot, will greet you along the way as your tour takes you to the Market, Main Bazaar, China Town, and other well-known city landmarks, including the Borneo Cultural Museum, among other places of interest.

Kuching is a great place to buy handicrafts, trinkets, and local products such as woodcarvings, the patterned, multi-coloured traditional ceremonial cloth known as "pua kumbu," and the versatile Sarawak pottery engraved with ethnic designs. Edible bird's nest, known for its health benefits, and pepper spice in a beautifully crafted ceramic cat figurine are unique and thoughtful gifts suitable for any occasion.

A must-visit while in Sarawak is a "Kek Lapis" delicatessen bakery. The famous Sarawak Kek Lapis is a traditional baked layered cake that comes in a variety of flavours with intricate designs and makes an excellent gift for friends and family.



BORNEO CULTURES MUSEUM (DURATION: 3 HOURS+-)

Includes: All guided tour, Entrance fee, and 1 bottle of drinking water

The Borneo Cultures Museum is a modern, five-storey structure with a distinctive architectural design that reflects Sarawak's unique traditional crafts and rich cultural heritage. The new museum aspires to be a vibrant hub of social and cultural exchange. The auditorium and function rooms on level one will be able to host a variety of events, transforming the museum into a lively venue. The visitor facilities, such as a reception desk, restaurant, and shop, are also located here to meet the visitors' basic needs. The Children's Gallery and the Arts and Crafts Gallery are both on level two. Through its exhibitions and activities, the Children's Gallery provides an optimal interactive learning environment for children. The theme 'Love Our Rivers' focuses on the concept of sustainability, with rivers serving as the foundation of the exhibition narrative. Visitors can learn traditional crafts, dances, and music through activities in the Arts and Crafts Gallery. Level three has the largest gallery, with 2,188 square metres of exhibition space. The exhibition theme is 'In Harmony with Nature,' and it examines local communities' relationships with the natural environment through a river journey through three major geographical regions. This exhibition offers multisensory and immersive experiences.

The 'Time Changes' exhibition, located on level four, will feature displays with a strong educational focus. This informative gallery will appeal to school groups as it covers historical topics covered in the school curriculum. The archaeological discoveries and findings in the state are also included. The narrative traces Sarawak's history from prehistoric eras to the present day. The topmost floor, level five, houses the museum's masterpieces as well as the best examples of Sarawak's material culture. The 'Objects of Desire' gallery will have a strong object focus, allowing visitors to admire the artistic beauty of these artefacts. The gallery will display artefacts that demonstrate skilled craftsmanship, have designs with divine powers, and are status symbols.



HALF DAY TOUR (EX. CITY)

SARAWAK CULTURAL VILLAGE (DURATION: 3-4 HOURS+-)

Includes: All guided tour, Entrance fee, Cultural show performance, 1 bottle drinking water

The Village, also known as the "Living Museum," is a kaleidoscope of Sarawak's cultures and traditions. Upon arrival, explore the seven authentic replicas of ethnic houses, including the Chinese Farm House, Malay's Stilted House, Melanau Tall House, Penan Hut, and Longhouses of the Iban, Bidayuh, and Orang Ulu ethnic groups. The many artefacts created by the individual dwellers are displayed in each house. While touring the village, you can see demonstrations of arts and crafts like beadwork, wood and bamboo carvings, "Pua" weaving, and straw weaving. Enjoy the visual treat of a cultural extravaganza performance by various ethnic groups at the Village Theatre.



SEMENGGOH WILDLIFE CENTRE (DURATION: 3 HOURS+-)

Includes: Includes: All guided tour, Entrance fee, and 1 bottle of drinking water

The orangutans are free to roam in this 653-hectare forest reserve, unlike in a zoo. Young and adolescent orangutans are trained here to be self-sufficient in the wild. Observe their delicate nests, as well as their deft movements in the treetops and fascinating feeding behaviour. The guide will also narrate the behavioural and characteristics of this unique primate known as the orangutan, or "man of the forest".

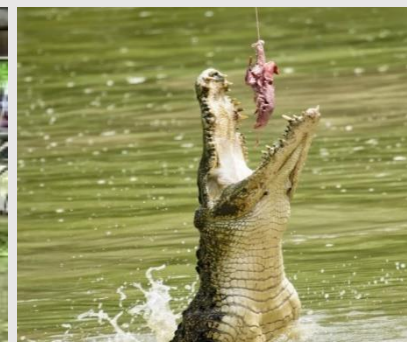


HALF DAY TOUR (EX. CITY)

CROCODILE FARM & MINI ZOO (DURATION: 3 HOURS+-)

Includes: Includes: All guided tour, Entrance fee, and 1 bottle of drinking water

Amidst lush greenery, the farm is home to over 1,000 saltwater and freshwater crocodiles. It is an ideal haven for these fearsome reptiles, who are housed in enclosures that resemble their natural habitat. During feeding time, keep an eye out for crocodiles in action. Explore the farm to see other fascinating animals like bearcats, pythons, peacocks, otters, and the Arapaima Gigas, the world's largest freshwater fish.



ANNAH RAIS BIDAYUH LONGHOUSE (DURATION: 4 HOURS+-)

Includes: Includes: All guided tour, Entrance fee, and 1 bottle of drinking water

Sarawak's second most populous ethnic group, the Bidayuh, was also known as the 'Land Dayak' and the 'Engineer of Bamboo'. Annah Rais, one of Sarawak's most famous Bidayuh longhouses, is located about 100 kilometres east of Kuching and features magnificent architecture made mostly of bamboo. The journey will take approximately one and a half hours. You will also be able to observe the villagers as they go about their daily activities, such as rice pounding and winnowing, basket and mat weaving, and bamboo carving, during your visit. The most notable and significant structure is the "Baruk," or head house, which is located in front of the longhouse. The Baruk was once used as a defensive fort to protect the entire village from attack. Real human skulls hang around the central fireplace in the 'Baruk,' as does their sacred war drum.



HALF DAY TOUR (EX. CITY)

FAIRY & WIND CAVE (DURATION: 4 HOURS+)

Includes: Includes: All guided tour, Entrance fee, and 1 bottle of drinking water

The Fairy Cave is three stories high. After a short ascent, the cave opens up into a main chamber. As sunlight streams into the chamber, the beautiful shapes of nature's creations, the stalactites and stalagmites, are revealed. The Wind Cave, a tunnel-like cave filled with bats and swiftlets, was once an underground river chamber. Look around the cave walls for any swiftlet nests.



KUBAH NATIONAL PARK (DURATION: 4 HOURS+)

Includes: Includes: All guided tour, Entrance fee, and 1 bottle of drinking water

Kubah National Park, which is only 20 kilometres from Kuching, is an excellent day trip destination. The park's allure stems from its scenic rainforest, waterfalls, streams, and 93 different species of palm trees. The Waterfall trails, one of the most popular, wind through a mixed dipterocarp forest with numerous plank walk sections and cross swampy areas and small jungle streams. The trail is lined with wild durian trees. The waterfall is divided into several sections, with the main section dropping 10 metres onto a wide rocky ridge. Below this ridge is a small pool, ideal for a cool and refreshing jungle dip.

Item to bring: Light clothing, towel, raincoat, insect repellent, sunblock, and walking shoes



HALF DAY TOUR (EX. CITY)

GUNUNG GADING NATIONAL PARK (DURATION: 5-6 HOURS+-)

Includes: Includes: All guided tour, Entrance fee, and 1 bottle of drinking water

This is the national park where you can see the world's largest flower, the Rafflesia, and getting there by land will take an hour and thirty minutes. When in bloom, it can reach three feet in width, and the flower emits a distinct foul odour that attracts flies and other insects for pollination. The wooden plank walkway will take you through dense primary and secondary tropical forests, where you may see squirrels darting from tree to tree and if you're lucky, a chance encounter with a white-crested hornbill.

Item to bring: Light clothing, towel, raincoat, insect repellent, sunblock, walking shoe



MATANG WILDLIFE CENTRE (DURATION: 4 HOURS+-)

Includes: Includes: All guided tour, Entrance fee, and 1 bottle of drinking water

The Matang Wildlife Centre, located in Kubah National Park, 35 kilometres from Kuching, and spanning 179 hectares of lowland rainforest, is home to endangered wildlife and animals in various stages of rehabilitation. Here, visitors can get information and learn about Sarawak's wildlife. The centre is home to several eco-tourism projects, including the Heart-to-Heart Orangutan Training Program, in which young orangutans are taught or retrained to survive in the wild. These orangutans were either orphaned or rescued from captivity. Aside from these adorable primates, there are also sun bears, sambar deer, and civet cats, as well as three large aviaries housing sea eagles, hornbills, and other birds.



HALF DAY TOUR (EX. CITY)

MORNING DOLPHIN SPOTTING CRUISE (DURATION: 3 HOURS+)

Includes: Includes: All guided tour, Boat fee, Return transfer, and 1 bottle drinking water

The cruise crisscrosses the Santubong River's mouth searching for the elusive Irrawaddy dolphin. The Irrawaddy dolphin, also known as the snub-fin dolphin, lives in rivers, estuaries, and along the coast. Santubong is one of the best places to see this unusual marine mammal. Dolphins can frequently be seen swimming and diving around small fishing boats in the estuary. They have been spotted playing in the open water on occasion. Visitors will need to keep an eye out for the dolphins at first, but after a short wait, they can frequently be seen surfacing around the boat. The cruise will also take you up the Salak River, giving you a glimpse into the life of a fishing village on stilts.

EVENING WILDLIFE & NATURE WATCHING CRUISE (DURATION: 4 HOURS+)

Includes: Includes: All guided tour, Boat fee, Return transfer and 1 bottle of drinking water

Cruise along the mouth of the Santubong Peninsula, where Irrawaddy dolphins are frequently spotted. The mangrove-lined rivers are home to a variety of animals, including the Proboscis monkey. As the night fades, look for the proboscis monkey, which usually congregates in small groups on the treetops near the water's edge as they settle in for the night. Keep an eye out for crocodiles resting on the mud banks and catch a glimpse of their bright, glinting eyes as the torchlight is shone over the river bank as we cruise upriver to watch the fireflies fluttering around the mangrove branches, briefly lighting up the night sky before bidding farewell as we cruise back.

HALF DAY TOUR (EX. CITY)

SATANG ISLAND EXCURSION (DURATION: 5 HOURS+-)

Includes: Return transfer, Boat Trip, 1 packed lunch, 1 bottle drinking water & goggle provided

Excludes: Optional activities costs, Personal Expenses, Tips and gratuities

In the morning, take a boat trip to Satang Island, which is part of the Talang-Satang National Park and is protected for sea turtle conservation. Along the way, you might see mudskippers foraging on the mid-banks or tiny, agile flying fish leaping across the bow of your boat; if you're lucky, you may even spot some Irrawaddy dolphins. Visit the turtle hatchery upon arrival to learn about the conservation efforts being undertaken to help these endangered sea creatures. Swim and snorkel in the pristine waters, known for their beautiful corals and colourful fishes. Packed lunch is provided; after lunch, transfer back to the jetty and make your way back.

Item to bring: Light clothing, towel, raincoat, swimwear, waterproof camera, insect repellent, sunblock, flat shoes (prepare to get wet). Sighting of wildlife is NOT guaranteed.



SARAWAK RIVER CRUISE (DURATION: 1 ½ HOURS) (1730 - 1900hrs)

Includes: Return transfer, Cruise fee, Light refreshment

Cruise along the Sarawak River, retracing James Brooke's journey when he first arrived in Sarawak, and enjoy the enchanting sunset and night view of various phases of the city. Take in the sights of the Waterfront, Brooke Dockyard, the 100-year-old Malay Kampung, Fort Margherita, Astana, Square Tower, colourful fishing boats that dotted the riverbanks and the mansions of Kuching's affluent society. This living scenery offers a glimpse into Kuching's history and way of life.



HALF DAY TOUR (EX. CITY)

MEDAN NIAGA SATOK (DURATION: 1 ½ HOURS)

Includes: Return transfer & 1 bottle of drinking water

Medan Niaga Satok (popularly known as Satok Market or Kubah Ria among locals) operates every Saturday afternoon until Sunday morning. The market is renowned for the native ladies who set up shops here selling fruit and vegetables. Walk around and look at all the colourful and exotic vegetables that have been arranged on mats or canvases to attract buyers.

The stalls at Medan Niaga Satok are divided into several categories. It is a bustling market with diverse cultural perspectives, a cacophony of unfamiliar languages (especially for those who are only familiar with standard Malay and English), and a wide range of products. There are many exotic fruits and vegetables, such as the jungle fern known as "midin", "Snake Skin" fruits, and wild "belimbing." Sago worms, a unique Melanau delicacy high in protein and thought to be a cure for asthma, are occasionally available for sale, typically eaten fresh or fried as snacks.

There are also Chinese and Malay stalls selling a variety of items, including the famous freshwater salted fish, 'ikan terubok masin', ikan bakar, local handicrafts and ethnic carvings, fruits, vegetables, poultry, seafood, unique plants and flowers such as wild orchids and wild honey, traditional herbs (used as medicine), pets, and even clothing. In addition, the market sells a variety of local kuih and snacks.

The best time to go is Saturday night or early Sunday morning.



SINIAWAN OLD TOWN NIGHT MARKET (DURATION: 2-3 HOURS)

Includes: Return transfer & 1 bottle of drinking water

Depart from the city hotel at 17:30 hrs. for Siniawan, a small town in the Bau district, some 25 km from Kuching. Siniawan turns from a sleepy hollow by day to a vibrant enclave by night during the weekends, with a bustling weekend night bazaar drawing visitors and foodies alike to soak in the nostalgia of a bygone era while sampling delicious local food right in the main street of two iconic rows of antique wooden shophouses decked in bright red lanterns. Siniawan is a great experience for photography enthusiasts to capture the spectacular change in colour hue before sunset and the moods of the evening and night of an old-fashioned "cowboy" town come to life.

Weekends only: Enjoy the night market on a Friday, Saturday, or Sunday.



HALF DAY TOUR (EX. CITY)

KUBAH BIRDING TOUR (DURATION: 4 - 5 HOURS+)

Includes: All guided tour, Entrance fee, Return transfer & 1 bottle of drinking water

Kubah National Park, located on a sandstone plateau, is about an hour's drive from Kuching City. Kubah's forest is a mix of dipterocarp and scrub forest, with isolated patches of kerangas that are home to mammals, reptiles, amphibians, and endemic birds like the Bornean Banded Kingfisher, Bornean Wren Babbler, Yellow-rumped Flycatcher, and Blue-banded Pittas. Resident birds include Red-bearded Bee-eater, Raffle's Malkoha, Banded Broadbill, Grey-bellied Bulbul, Crimson Sunbird, Spotted Fantail, Rufous-crowned Paradise and Chestnut-Naped Forktail. Spend the day birding at this wonderful park.



EVENING FROGGING TOUR (DURATION: 4 - 5 HOURS+)

Includes: All guided tour, Entrance fee, return transfer, Refreshment pack & 1 bottle of drinking water

Pick up at your hotel and drive to Kubah National Park, which is located on a sandstone plateau about an hour's drive from Kuching. Kubah's forest is a mix of dipterocarp and scrub forest, with isolated patches of kerangas that are home to endemic birds, mammals, reptiles, and amphibians. More than 61 species have been identified in the park, accounting for roughly one-third of the total number of frog species found on Borneo Island. The Lowland litter frog, Bornean horned frog, Matang narrow-mouthed frog, Kuhl's creek frog, Giant River frog, Peat swamp frog, Mahogany frog, Spotted stream frog, File-eared tree frog, Dark-eared tree frog, and Harlequin tree frog, among other species, are the most commonly spotted in the Park.



HALF DAY TOUR (EX. CITY)

WORLD WAR II (WWII) HISTORICAL TOUR (DURATION: 3 HOURS+)

Includes: All guided tour, Entrance fee, return transfer & 1 bottle of drinking water

Pick up at the hotel and proceed for World War II Historic Tour. Not many people are aware that there are several places around Kuching city playing a significant role during the Second World War. Your guide will also narrate events beyond the Japanese occupation, that is, during the emergency, the confrontation, and the Sulu invasion.

The tour started by visiting the museum at the Teacher Education Institute of Malaysia, Batu Lintang Campus, where under the History unit, the Institute started a small museum in remembrance of the sacrifices of the people of Sarawak. Among the more interesting artefacts on display include equipment used by soldiers of that era and a flag post used by the Japanese army and a monument acknowledging the sacrifices of the fallen, as well as to see the last remaining buildings from that era on the campus, that is, the barrack used by the Punjabi soldiers and an ammunition store

The second place to visit will be the Japanese cemetery, which started possibly at the turn of the last century around 1902 and has about 40 tombstones remaining.

The tour concluded with a visit to the Heroes Memorial, honouring the fallen heroes during the Japanese Occupation, Iban Trackers, killed in the line of duty during the emergency, and the fallen heroes during the confrontation.



FULL DAY TOUR (EX. CITY)

BENGOH DAM & KAMPUNG STING HIKING (DURATION: 7 HOURS+)

Includes: All guided tour, Boat fee, 1 Lunch, Return transfer & 1 bottle of drinking water

Benggoh Dam is located in the quiet and rural Padawan township, about an hour's drive from Kuching. Your scenic journey begins with a half-hour boat ride to the trail's starting point. The well-travelled path leads you under a canopy of tall trees, through picturesque bamboo bridges, and across boulders and ridges to the breathtakingly Pe'an and Susung waterfalls. Enjoy the well-deserve cool refreshing jungle dip. Lunch is provided. After the hearty lunch, be ready to trek back.



FULL DAY TOUR (EX. CITY)

KAYAKING EXPERIENCE (DURATION: 7 HOURS+)

Includes: All guided tour, 1 Lunch, return transfer & 1 bottle of drinking water

Pick up from the hotel and proceed to Semadang River, in the Padawan area, which is around one and a half hours by road and offers scenic countryside views of undulating terrain dotted by small-scale pepper farms. You will be instructed on how to paddle and steer the kayak and how to wear the life jacket and helmet properly. A safety briefing will also be given. Your downriver kayaking adventure will take place in a calm and scenic body of water, bringing you to the Aruang Piin Trusan Mini Waterfall and Sibudak riverbank, where we will have a brief stop for a cool dip as well as experience hand-feeding feedstuffs to wild fish and body rafting before proceeding to the lunch site, which is the ending point of the kayaking route

Shower facilities are available on-site. Freshen up and depart the base camp en route to Kuching.

Item to bring: Light clothing, towel, swimwear, waterproof camera, insect repellent, sunblock, and flat shoes (prepare to get wet).



FULL DAY TOUR (EX. CITY)

BAKO NATIONAL PARK (DURATION: 7 HOURS+)

Includes: All guided tours, Boat fee, Entrance fee, 1 Lunch, return transfer & 1 bottle of drinking water

Bako National Park is Sarawak's oldest and most popular national park, providing the ideal introduction to the state's forest and wildlife. It has diverse vegetation, jungle streams, waterfalls, interesting plant life, trekking trails, and coastlines with small bays, coves, and beaches. Visitors can see wildlife such as proboscis monkeys, long-tailed macaques, Borneo bearded pigs, and monitor lizards. You will be able to see almost desert-like scrub, or "padang," on the plateau and lowland dipterocarp forest. Erosion has left some spectacular sandstone formations, such as the well-known Sea Stack.

Recommended Trail: Paku Trail. Please keep in mind that the park guide will assess your fitness level and interests before recommending the best trail.



FULL DAY TOUR (EX. CITY)

FAIRY CAVE + TASIK BIRU + PAKU ROCK MAZE (DURATION: 7 HOURS+)

Includes: Includes: All guided tour, Entrance fee, and 1 bottle of drinking water

The Fairy Cave stands 3-storey high. After a quick climb, the cave opens up into a main chamber. Sunlight streams into the chamber, revealing to you the beautiful shapes of nature's creations, the stalactites and stalagmites.

Tasik Biru, or known as Blue Lake, is previously the largest gold mine in Sarawak from 1898-1921. It is also known as Tai Parit, the largest open-air mine producing gold and antimony. The Tasik Biru site measures 390m long, 160m wide and 45m deep. The Roxy Tasik Biru Floating Chalets were added to the Tasik Biru Resort City, at the end of 2021 which is perfect for relaxing holidays and getaways. Other than that, Visitors can take a boat ride (own expense) on the lake or a thrilling walk on the floating bridge. Be mesmerized by the amazing rock formations around the lake, and the lush greeneries and lake full of fishes.

Photo stop at Paku Rock Maze Garden. Paku rock maze is a naturally formed stone forest landform located behind the Shiwang Temple. Paku rock maze garden, in addition to the representative "Golden Hoop", also has a mini "Five Fingers Mountain" standing in the centre. The name "Five Fingers Mountain" comes not only from the similar shape of its five ridges but also echoes the culture and the folklore of "Monkey King" together with the roots of the "Golden Hoop".



OVERNIGHT TOUR (EX. CITY)

2D1N BENGGOH DAM & KAMPUNG STING ADVENTURE (DURATION: OVERNIGHT)

Includes: All guided tour, Boat fee, Longhouse Expenses, 3 Meals (B/L/D), Return transfer & 1 bottle of drinking water

Day 1 - Pick up in the city and transfer to Kampung Sting. Enjoy the one-hour drive to rural and tranquil Padawan, where Benggoh Dam is located. Your scenic journey begins with a fifteen-minute boat ride from the jetty to the trail leading to Kampung Sting, located on a hilltop with a panoramic, breathtaking view of Benggoh Dam. A simple lunch is provided.

Start the trek to Pe'an and Curtain waterfalls, which will take roughly 30 minutes for both waterfalls. Enjoy a well-deserved 15-minute break before continuing to Susung Waterfall, which will take another 30 minutes. Reputed as the most picturesque waterfall, be sure to take the perfect snap for the much-anticipated posting on social media. Trek back to homestay. Dinner is provided, and you can rest the night away under the stars and be serenaded by nature.

Day 2 - Enjoy the sunrise breakfast the next morning. Pack up and return by boat to the jetty for your transfer to Kuching.

2D1N BAKO NATIONAL PARK (DURATION: OVERNIGHT)

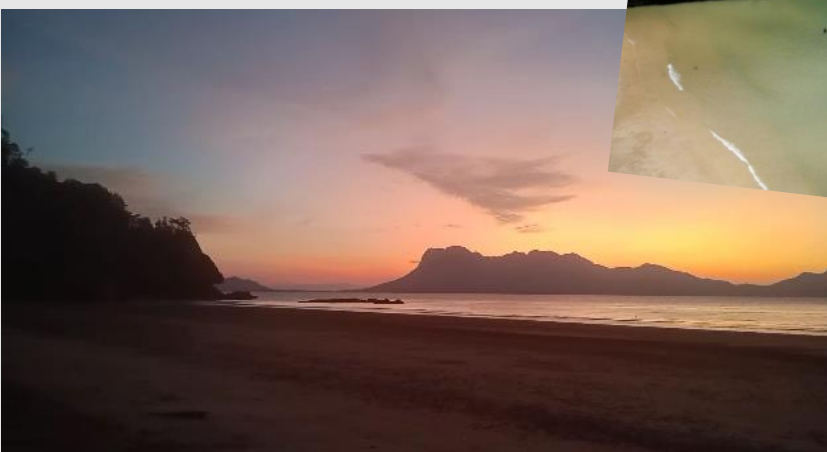
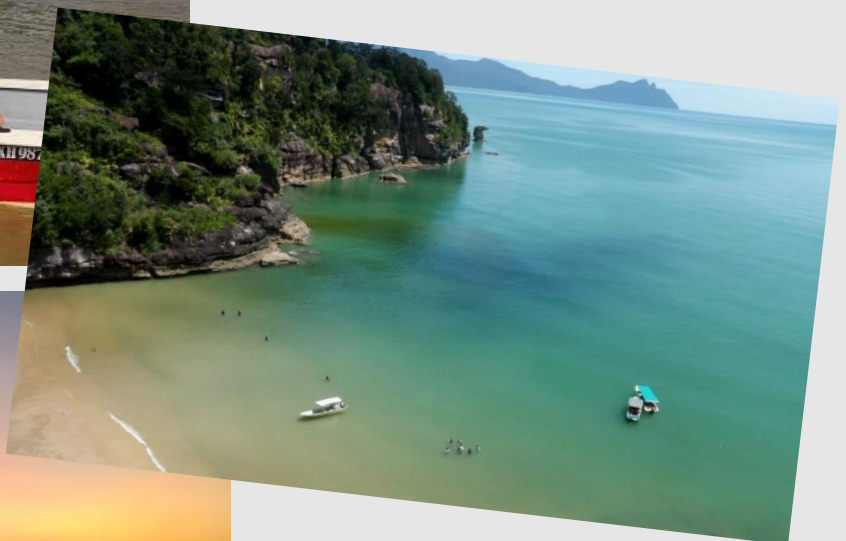
The diverse ecosystem, extensive jungle trail system, picturesque coastline, and excellent wildlife sightings make it the ideal introduction to Sarawak's forest and wildlife. Bako National Park is unique in that wildlife is almost always nearby. Proboscis monkeys, long-tailed macaques, and silver leaf monkeys are occasionally spotted near the park headquarters. Bearded boars, monitor lizards, and a variety of bird species can also be seen.

Bako's extensive hiking trails, consisting of seventeen networked trails, offer a series of walking and trekking options, from short and easy walks close to the park headquarters to full days of hikes into the jungle, ensuring each trail is a different learning experience.

Upon arrival, begin exploring the trails and searching for wildlife with the guide. Lunch at the park canteen and then continue to explore Bako. After dinner, proceed for a night walk by torchlight.

Day 2 ~ Following breakfast, hike one of the trails to spot rare migratory birds, langurs, reptiles, proboscis monkeys and other plant species. Lunch is provided at the park before returning to Kuching by mid-afternoon.

Recommended Trail: Day 1 – Paku Trail / Day 2 – Tanjung Sapi trail. Please keep in mind that the park guide will evaluate your fitness level and interests before recommending the best trail for you.

Recommended Trail: Day 1 - Delima Trail / Day 2 - Lintang Trail / Day 3 - Sapi Trail. Please keep in mind that the park guide will evaluate your fitness level and interests before recommending the best trail for you.



OVERNIGHT TOUR (EX. CITY)

2D1N IBAN LONGHOUSE SAFARI (DURATION: OVERNIGHT)

Includes: All guided tour, Boat fee, Longhouse Expenses, 4 Meals (B/2L/D), Return transfer & 1 bottle of drinking water

Day 1 ~ Pick up from the hotel and begin your Iban longhouse safari adventure. The four-hour drive will take you through scenic greenery and countryside views of undulating terrain dotted with vegetable farms and padi fields, as well as rubber, pepper, oil palm, and cocoa plantations, which are some of Sarawak's top revenue-earning crops.

We will make a brief stop in Serian, a native town, to see the bustling daily wet market and some of the rare jungle produce brought in by locals and displayed on mats or colourful canvases to attract buyers.

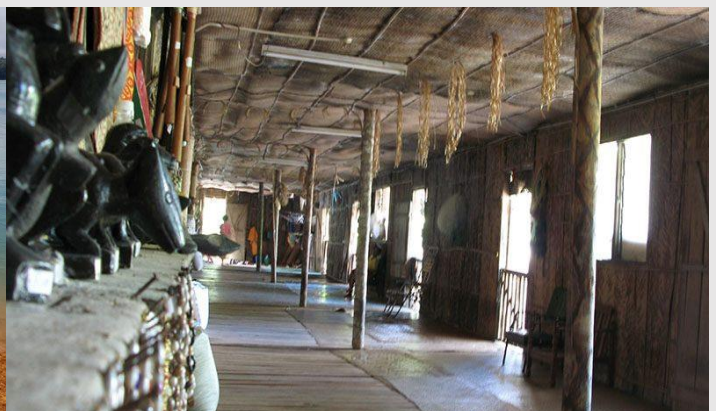
Lunch is at Lachau, a small and well-known "cowboy" town where tribal natives from Indonesia's nearby Kalimantan border town come to barter trade and sell their produce, and where you can also do last-minute gift shopping for your Iban host.

The road trip will end at the riverbank, where you will experience a longboat ride upstream. The duration of the journey will depend on the water level and which longhouse you visit. The longboat is piloted by one boatman and one person in front of the hull, who acts as a navigator and steers the boat by giving hand signals to the boatman to avoid hidden tree stumps or logs along the way. During the dry season, be prepared to walk along the river bank and through the jungle as the boatman carries the engines until such time when we can go back on the water again in deeper parts, with another longboat waiting for us.

Upon arrival, mingle with the longhouse residents and experience communal living. Learn about their hunting methods, bamboo cooking meals, and their reliance on the forest for everything from food to medicine. Enjoy local delicacies such as the famous 'Tuak,' a locally brewed rice wine, and take part in the "Najat," a traditional warrior dance. Overnight at Guesthouse.

Day 2 ~ After breakfast, join in a demonstration of "cock fighting" and blowpipe. You can also take a guided trek through the jungle to learn about the various plants and animals that are important to the local culture and way of life.

Depart from the longhouse around mid-morning and travel overland to Kuching. Lunch at Lachau town.

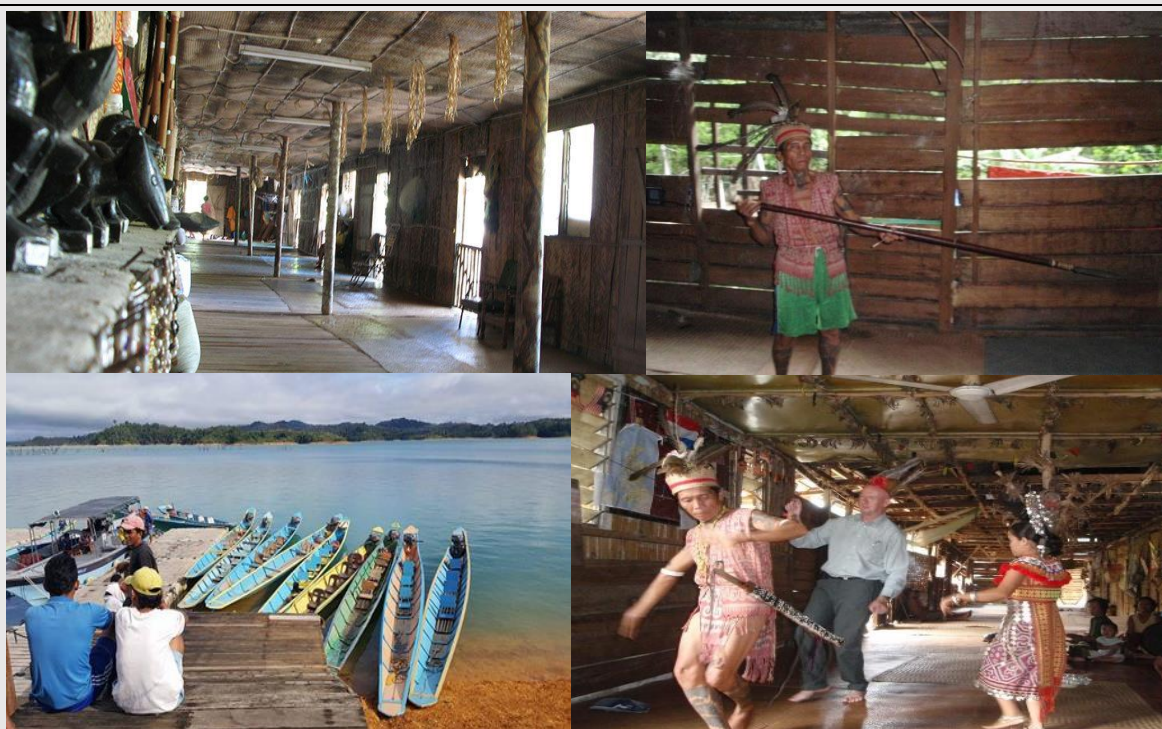

On arrival at Batang Ai dam, experience a thirty-minute longboat ride across the lake before arriving at the longhouse nestled on the hillside. Mingle with the locals and share a moment of their day. In the evening, after a hearty dinner of local fare, join the rest of the longhouse folks and enjoy an evening of traditional music and dance with rounds of "tuak," a locally brewed rice wine. Overnight at the guesthouse.

Day 2 ~ Following breakfast, proceed for a nature walk to learn about the various plant species and animals that are vital to their culture and way of life. Enjoy a picnic lunch on the riverbank. Later in the day, return to the longhouse for leisure to enjoy your surroundings and observe the locals going about their daily lives. In the evening, enjoy your local dinner at your leisure.

Day 3 ~ After breakfast, join in the demonstration of "cock fighting" and blowpipe. Bid farewell to your host. Return to the jetty for your journey back to Kuching. Lunch at Lachau town and continue to Kuching. Drop off at the city hotel.



OVERNIGHT TOUR (EX. CITY)

3D2N MULU 4 SHOW CAVES

Includes: 02-night stay at Mulu Marriott Resort & Spa, 4 Meals (2B/2D) at Resort, 1 picnic lunch on Day 2 (Clearwater excursion), Park entrance fee, return boat and land transfer, 4 show caves tour & Penan Village visit, MAS Wing flight (Kuching-Mulu-Kuching), 20KG check-in luggage allowance, English speaking guide

Gunung Mulu National Park is arguably famous for its limestone karst formations, and some of the most spectacular caves on earth. Mulu is home to the world's largest underground chamber (the Sarawak Chamber), the world's largest cave passage (Deer Cave) and the longest cave in Southeast Asia (Clearwater Cave). The park's biodiversity is equally impressive with Mulu containing 15 different types of forest – including mixed dipterocarp, heath, peat swamp, moss forest and montane vegetation – and thousands of species of ferns, fungi, mosses and flowering plants. The Park is also home to a wide variety of mammals, reptiles, birds, amphibians, fish and insects and other invertebrates. The four “show caves” can be visited as day trips from the park HQ; accessible by jungle trails, plank walkways or pathways through the caves.

Day 1 - Deer & Lang Cave

Deer Cave, the world's largest cave passage, where from a vantage point, a perfect profile of “President Lincoln” can be observed. Next, to Lang cave, and marvel at limestone formation, stalactites and stalagmites. Proceed to the Bat Observatory, to witness a spectacular exodus of bats during sundown (Subject to weather conditions).

Day 2 - Batu Bungan - Penan Settlement, Wind Cave & Clearwater Cave

Transfer by longboat to Batu Bungan, a Penan settlement, to observe the locals going about their daily lives and do some gift shopping for handicrafts on display for sale. Continue the journey upriver to Wind Cave with its impressive ‘King’s Chamber’ and Clearwater Cave with its natural habitat, home to unique plant species such as the one-leafed plant. Enjoy a simple packed lunch and cool off in a wonderful swimming area shaded by giant rainforest trees. After lunch, transfer back to the resort, free to explore at your leisure.

Day 3 - Departure Day

Free at leisure after breakfast. Drop off at Mulu airport for departure flight
